The city uses national standards when doing the study. In short, our score wasn't high enough for the city to do anything at the moment. We can try again in 2026 if that's the direction the neighborhood wants to go. NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH TIPS

The holiday season is a festive occasion but also a time when homeowners should be aware of the increase in crime that occurs. A few suggestions are listed to help keep our neighborhood safe.

As our society has become more technologically advanced, criminals have capitalized on new opportunities to take advantage of unsuspecting law-abiding homeowners by re-inventing a few age-old scams:

- One is the Money Order or "Secret Shopper" Scam. In this scam, the homeowner receives a money order with a request that they deposit the money. The homeowner is offered a "deal" stating that they can keep some of the money if they forward the rest to an unknown person, business or organization. You should never accept money orders in these circumstances. The criminal is looking to trick you out of your money.
- Another is the "Grandchild in Trouble" Scam. This scam targets senior homeowners. The homeowner receives a
 phone call from someone who claims to be their grandchild. The caller says something like they're in jail, had an
 accident, or their money was lost or stolen. The caller tells the homeowner not to tell anyone, especially their
 parents, then requests the homeowner send them money.

General holiday & crime prevention tips

- Make sure all doors and windows have secondary locks (window pins, deadbolts dowels, etc.) and use them.
- Don't hide spare keys in planters or under doormats.
- Ensure that dark areas and entrances have outdoor lights that are turned on after dark or are sensor-activated.
- Place gifts where they can't be seen from the outside.
- Lock your vehicles and remove all valuables. Yes, even in the driveway.
- Use caution anytime there is a stranger at your door.
- Be suspicious of unexpected sales calls or deliveries. Ask for identification.
- Ask a trusted friend or neighbor to watch your home.
- Use timers for lights and radios while you're away.
- Remember to make arrangements for mail and newspapers.
