NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

When the mercury dips, nothing is cozier than snuggling up by a warm fireplace! Yet, sadly, improper use and poor maintenance are to blame for 37% of all home heating fires. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), 38% of home fire deaths occur between December and January. The NFPA and the U.S. Fire Administration urge consumers to take the precautions listed below to ensure fireplace safety:

- Have chimneys and wood stoves inspected and cleaned annually.
- Make sure the area around the hearth is free of debris, decorations, and other flammable materials.
- Leave glass doors open while burning a fire (closing the metal mesh will help contain embers). Close glass doors after extinguishing the fire.
- Use only dry, seasoned wood or wood pellets. Never use flammable liquids to start a fire or burn cardboard, trash, or other debris in your indoor fireplace.
- Allow ashes to cool before disposing of them in a tightly covered metal container. Douse ashes with water and store them away from your home and other buildings.
